FROM THE DESK OF FR. ERIC ANDERSEN

Why is there a stigma against cremation? Let's look at the history of cremation: The Catholic Encyclopedia gives us this: "The custom of burning the bodies of the dead dates back to very early times. The Pre-Canaanites practised it until the introduction of inhumation among them along with the civilization of the Semitic people about 2500 B.C. History reveals no trace of incineration among the Jewish people, except in extraordinary circumstances of war and pestilence" (Devlin, William. "Cremation." The Catholic Encyclopedia. Vol. 4. New York: Robert Appleton Company, 1908.).

"The Christians never burned their dead, but followed from earliest days the practice of the Semitic race and the personal example of their Divine Founder. It is recorded that in times of persecution many risked their lives to recover the bodies of martyrs for the holy rites of Christian burial. The pagans, to destroy faith in the resurrection of the body, often cast the corpses of martyred Christians into the flames, fondly believing thus to render impossible the resurrection of the body" (ibidem).

The practice of cremation seems to have become an issue in the late 18th and 19th centuries with the rise of "cremation societies" in western Europe inspired by the heresy of naturalism (a denial of the supernatural), or of pantheism and the belief in re-incarnation. The act of cremation was an anti-Catholic statement promoted by organizations that actively sought to undermine Catholic teaching. This attitude persists today and this is why the Catholic Church continues to prohibit cremation when "the choice is based on a 'sectarian spirit'; ...(or) if there is a hatred of the Catholic religion or the Church" (Funeral Policy of the Archdiocese of Portland, p. 6).

What does it mean to have a 'sectarian spirit?' One might consider him/herself Catholic but "refuse to accept the entire doctrine or to acknowledge the supreme authority of the Catholic Church" (Weber, Nicholas. "Sect and Sects." The Catholic Encyclopedia. Vol. 13. New York: Robert Appleton Company, 1912.). In such a case, it would be an act of rebellion to choose cremation as an effort to assert his/her independence or autonomy from the Church. That would be the worst reason to choose cremation. If, however, one chose cremation for innocent reasons, without guile, or out of financial necessity, then there would be no dogmatic opposition to the practice.

PHILOSOPHY NIGHT: DANTE'S PURGATORIO


