FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

"The Immaculate Heart of Mary"

This coming Thursday, August 22nd, we will celebrate the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, on the date to which it was originally assigned in 1945: the Octave Day of the Assumption. There is an interesting history regarding this feast given in the Office of Matins:

"At the beginning of the nineteenth century the Apostolic See first approved the liturgical worship by which the Immaculate Heart of the Virgin Mary is given due honor. The way was prepared for this cult by many holy men and women. Pope Pius VII instituted the feast of the Most Pure Heart of Mary, to be celebrated in a devout and holy way by all the dioceses and religious congregations which had requested it. Later, Pope Pius IX added the proper Office and Mass. But the ardent zeal and hope, which had arisen even in the seventeenth century and had grown day by day, that this feast should be given greater solemnity and be extended to the whole Church, was graciously fulfilled by Pope Pius XII in the year 1942, when a terrible war was spreading through almost the whole world. He had pity on the limitless hardships of the people, and because of his devotion and trust in the heavenly Mother, he solemnly commended the whole human race to her most gentle Heart and appointed that a feast with its own Office and Mass be celebrated forever and everywhere in honor of her Immaculate Heart" (Lesson vi. Matins for the Feast. 1962 Breviarium Romanum).

What this lesson from Matins does not mention is Our Lady of Fatima who requested the consecration. Pope Pius XII was consecrated a bishop in the Sistine Chapel on May 13th, 1917, at the same hour when Our Lady appeared to Lucia, Jacinta, and Francisco in the Cova da Iria in Fatima, Portugal. Mary warned of the errors of Russia that would spread and annihilate nations. Mary also warned of a greater war than the one raging in 1917, if her warnings were not heeded. She asked for the Pope to consecrate Russia to her Immaculate Heart. Many decades passed until Pope Pius XII, having been elected just as World War II was about to break out, took heed and consecrated the Church and the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on October 31st, 1942. The Second World War would end in 1945, "although one could not call 'peace' that which began in 1945, with half of Europe ending up in Soviet hands, and the Communist nightmare, and the beginning of the 'Cold War' that so many historians have described as 'the Third World War'." (Socci, The Fourth Secret of Fatima, 187-188).

It is not surprising that Pius XII would establish this feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the Octave Day of the Assumption, since it was from heaven that Our Lady requested the consecration. And since Lourdes and Fatima, among various other apparitions in the 19th century, had captured the attention of the Catholic world, it was time to declare a long held belief in the Assumption of Our Lady, to be a dogma. 1950 was the Holy Year, the Jubilee. **(continued** \rightarrow)

"The Immaculate Heart of Mary" (con't)

The Dogma was to be proclaimed on November 1st, 1950. On the vigil of the Proclamation, the night between October 30-31st, Pope Pius "walking in the Vatican gardens, saw happening the same miracle of the sun that occurred at Fatima on October 13, 1917. The pontiff, who was the only witness to the fact, referred to it in writing" (Socci, p. 189). It was also announced by the pope's representative publicly in Fatima, Portugal on October 13th, 1951, at the official closure of that holy year.

This past March 24th, I solemnly consecrated the parish of St. Stephen to the Immaculate Heart of Our Lady of Fatima. Our celebration of the Immaculate Heart this coming Thursday will be a special one for that reason and all those who wish to recite their consecration prayer will be invited to do so at Mass that morning. You may also do so privately at home with your families. Those who wish to consecrate themselves to Jesus through Mary may begin the 33 day preparation according to St. Louis de Montfort on September 4th to end on consecration day Oct 7th, the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.
