The Assumption is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will offer Masses at the following times: **Wednesday, Aug 14th** at 7 pm (The Vigil of the Assumption); **Thursday, Aug 15th** at 7 am and Noon.

FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

This coming Saturday will be the feast of the Finding of the Relics of St. Stephen, protomartyr. This is our parish's patron saint. It is not his primary feast, which falls on December 26th, but it is historically a great and important feast. We will celebrate a Low Mass Saturday morning as usual with veneration of his relic and observe the normal First Saturday devotions and Rosary after Mass. August 3rd is reputed to be the actual date of St. Stephen's martyrdom in the year of Our Lord's Ascension. His burial place was unknown for centuries until the following occurred:

Matins for Aug 3rd. 2 Nocturne. Lesson IV.

In the year of our Lord 415, in the reign of the Emperor Honorius, a Priest named Lucian, (dwelling at Caphargamala, about twenty miles from Jerusalem,) received a message from God, in consequence of which discovery was made of the bodies of the Saints Stephen the First Martyr, Gamaliel, Nicodemus, and Abibon, (the son of Gamaliel,) which had long been lying unknown and unheeded. Lucian was asleep when Gamaliel appeared to him in a dream as a tall comely old man of worshipful presence, told him where the bodies were lying, and bade him go to John, Patriarch of Jerusalem, and deal with him that they might have more honourable burial.

Lesson V.

When the Patriarch of Jerusalem heard it, he called together Bishops and Priests from the neighbouring cities, and betook himself to the place, where he found the tombs hewn in the rock, and a right sweet savour flowing forth from them. The thing being noised abroad, a great multitude of people came together, and many that were sick and weak of divers diseases returned home whole. The sacred body of holy Stephen was then carried with great pomp to the holy Church of Zion. Under the Emperor Theodosius the Younger it was taken to Constantinople and during the Popedom of Pelagius I. it was brought to Rome, where it has been laid in the sepulchre of the holy Martyr Lawrence in the Veranian Field.

Lesson VI.

From the Book The City of God, written by St. Augustine, Bishop of Hippo, xxii. 8.

When the Bishop Projectus brought some reliques of that most glorious Martyr Stephen to Tibilis, a great multitude came together and went out to meet the shrine. A blind woman prayed to be led to the Bishop who was bearing the hallowed deposit. She laid on the reliques the flowers which she was carrying, took them up again, touched her eyes with them and forthwith saw. She went forward rejoicing, at the head of the amazed procession, choosing her own path, and needing no more that any should lead her. I remember also the shrine of this same Martyr which hath been placed in the town of Synica, hard by this city of Hippo. Lucillus, Bishop of that place, was carrying it, with a multitude going before and following after when, all of a sudden, by bearing this hallowed burden, he was healed of the emerods, from which he was even then suffering, and which were being treated by a physician, an intimate friend of his, who was about to cut them. (end of Lesson)

The following day, Sunday, August 4th, the feast of St. Stephen will be celebrated with a Sung High Mass as an External Solemnity and we will enjoy the Medieval Festival of St. Stephen. This is the 3rd annual St. Stephen Festival in honor of our patron. We are currently in the midst of the novena to St. Stephen before his feast. Please entrust your intentions to him for the salvation of souls, the good of the parish, and a wholesome and virtuous celebration of the Festival. If you still need to volunteer, please see Joseph Salazar. We can use lots of help in preparing for the festival and carrying it out.

On First Saturdays, we pray an Act of Reparation for First Saturdays after Mass followed by the Rosary during Confessions. This devotion "consists in going to Confession, receiving Communion, reciting five decades of the Rosary and meditating for a quarter of an hour on the mysteries of the Rosary on the first Saturday. Confession may be made during the eight days preceding or following the first Saturday of each month, provided that Holy Communion be received in the state of grace. Should one forget to form the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, it may be formed at the next Confession, the occasion to go to confession being taken at the first opportunity."
