

## FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

A couple things to prepare for this spring: Candlemas, Septuagesima, and Devotions & Consecration to St. Joseph.

First comes Candlemas. We will celebrate this Feast on Sunday, February 2nd with the regular Low Latin Mass at 8 am and with a Sung Latin Missa Cantata at 10:30 am. This is the feast which celebrates the 40th day since the Nativity of the Lord. In the Gospel of St. Luke, we are told that "When the days of the purification of Mary were fulfilled according to the Law of Moses, they took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord." This Feast is known as the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Extraordinary Form and as the Presentation of the Lord in the Ordinary Form. On this day, the priest blesses candles, distributes them to the faithful, and there is a procession, even at a Low Mass. Weather permitting, the procession will go outside even if briefly. Please dress accordingly. This feast is the last event of the Christmas season before entering into the season of Septuagesima.

Septuagesima (the 70 Days) is the proximate preparation for the season of Quadragesima (the 40 Days of Lent). During this Septuagesima season the Alleluia is suppressed from after First Vespers of Septuagesima until the Easter Vigil. There are three Sundays of Septuagesima before Ash Wednesday. The Season of Septuagesima takes on the appearance of Lent, but without the disciplines of Lent. It is as if to say: "Get ready. Lent is coming sooner than you think."

This bulletin letter is giving you notice to get ready for Septuagesima. We will celebrate all three weeks of Septuagesima as a parish which means that all Masses during this time will be in the Extraordinary Form. While I was the assistant to Fr. John Boyle here at St. Stephen's, he had made note that switching between Septuagesima and Ordinary Time was too confusing for the people and the priests. He and I had made the decision back then that we needed to just take the whole parish into the Extraordinary Form for this mini-liturgical season which is not observed in the Ordinary Form. This means that the month of February will be a Traditional Latin month. When we get to March 1st, it will be the First Sunday of Lent and the 10:30 am Sunday Mass will return to English until Passiontide and the Triduum.

Another thing to prepare for: The Seven Sundays of St. Joseph which begin on Sunday, February 2nd and continue until his Solemnity on March 19th. This brings up the idea of consecrating the parish and its families to St. Joseph as a follow up from last year's consecration to Jesus through Mary. The preparation for St. Joseph will follow a 40-day preparation period beginning on Saturday/Sunday, February 8th/9th. Keep watch for more details.

You are truly what it means to be, you are the whole of what it means to exist. This, if it be possible for me, I should like to know by way of demonstration. Help me then, O Lord, as I investigate how much our natural reason can learn about that true being which you are if we begin with the being which you have predicated of yourself' (God as First Principle ¶1.2). When she was dying of the influenza, the Blessed Mother gave her the choice to live an additional year of suffering and Jacinta said yes in order to offer it for the conversion of poor sinners. St. Stephen's Church and the World Apostolate of Fatima will host a special celebration for St. Jacinta (Hyacinth) of Fatima with Adoration, Confessions and Rosary in the church beginning at 5:30 pm followed by veneration of a 2nd class relic of St. Jacinta and a special edition of Philosophy/Theology Night in Carmody Hall at 7 pm.
