Devotions for the Holy Souls

This coming week, we will observe a series of Daily Masses for the Dead which is customary during the octave of All Saints. This kicks off the month of November, which is the month of the Holy Souls. To help the Holy Souls in Purgatory:

- 1. Have Masses offered for them.
- 2. Pray the Rosary and and the Chaplet for the Holy Souls (see below)
- 3. Pray the Stations of the Cross.
- 4. Offer up little sacrifices and fast.
- 5. Spread devotion to them.
- 6. Attend Eucharistic Adoration and pray for them.
- 7. Gain all the indulgences you can and apply them to the Holy Souls.
- 8. Visit a cemetery and pray for the faithful departed.

The Chaplet for the Holy Souls

(Prayed on a regular Rosary)

+ Make the Sign of the Cross

Say the Apostles Creed, Our Father, 3 Hail Mary's, and the Glory be....

For each decade, proceed as follows: On the large bead prior to 10 small beads, say:

"O Holy Souls

draw the fire of God's love into my soul, to reveal Jesus Crucified in me here on earth, rather than hereafter in Purgatory."

On each of the small beads, say:

"Crucified Lord Jesus,

have mercy on the souls in Purgatory."

When you have completed all 5 decades, say 3 times the Glory Be...

Pray the Prayer of St. Gertrude the Great, which is piously believed to release 1,000 souls from Purgatory each time it is prayed with faith and devotion:

Eternal Father, I offer You the most Precious Blood of Your Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, for all sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal Church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen.

The Raccolta recommends the following for the Faithful Departed:

- Praying the *Office of the Dead*, even if partially for the Holy Souls.
- Psalm 129 De Profundis,
- Psalm 50 Miserere
- Our Father, Hail Mary, and the versicle *Eternal rest* grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace, Amen.
- The Sequence *Dies Irae*, from the Requiem Mass

Please join us to pray along as our men's schola carries out this sacred office. Vesperale books are available with Latin and English side by side to follow along.

PLENARY INDULGENCE ALL SOULS: <u>THROUGH NOV 8TH</u>

Visiting a Cemetery: An indulgence is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. This indulgence is a plenary one from November 1 through November 8 and can be gained on each one of these days. On the other days of the year this indulgence is a partial one. (Coemeterii visitatio. Grant #13. Enchiridion Indulgentiarum, 1986).

Prayer for the Dead: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen." [A partial indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory (Requiem aeternam. Grant #46)].

Visiting a Church or an Oratory on All Souls Day: A plenary indulgence which is applicable only to the souls in purgatory is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a church or an oratory on All Souls Day. [This visit is to include the recitation of the Lord's Prayer and the Creed {Pater et Credo} (Visitatio ecclesiae vel oratorii in Commemoratione omnium fidlium defunctorum. Grant #67)].
