FAST AND ABSTINENCE LAWS AND DISCIPLINES

The current law of the Church obliges those age 14 and over to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Those age 18 through 59 are also obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting is defined as one full meal and two other meals which, when combined are less than a full meal.

The **former practice** and discipline in place in 1962 obliged those age 7 and over to **full abstinence** from meat on all Fridays of the year, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and the Vigil of Christmas (Christmas Eve).

Likewise, **formerly**, **partial abstinence** (meat permitted once a day at the principle meal): all the days of Lent, the Ember Days of Wednesday and Saturday, and the Vigils of Pentecost and the Assumption.

The **former law** for **fasting** applied to those age 21 through 59. Fasting was to be done on all days of Lent (except Sundays) from Ash Wednesday inclusive, Ember Days, and the Vigils of Christmas, Pentecost and the Assumption.

FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

During this Ember week, we observe three fast days (Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday) in the midst of 40 fast days. The Ember Days give a particular intention to the fast of these three days: consecrating the season of Spring to the LORD and praying for those preparing for priestly ordination this spring.

You might ask: Why do we skip Thursday? Jacobus Voragine tells us this: "The holy fathers had decreed that in order to pay due reverence to the day of the Lord's ascension, on which day our human nature rose to heaven and was lifted above the choirs of angels, Thursday should always be treated as a solemn holy day, and no fast should be observed on that day. Indeed, in the primitive Church, Thursday was celebrated equally with Sunday, and a solemn procession was held to represent the procession of the disciples or of the angels themselves. There was a popular proverb which said that 'Thursday is Sunday's cousin,' because in times past it was just as dedicated a day. But then the feasts of the saints intervened and it was burdensome to celebrate so many feasts, so the solemnizing of Thursday fell into disuse" (Golden Legend. Vol. I, pg. 132).

Why fast on Wednesday, Friday and Saturday? Fr. Stapper explains: "Already in Christian antiquity, Wednesday and Friday were kept with fasting and prayer...because they recalled the beginning...and the end of the Saviour's Passion. The Christians were also thereby distinguished from the Pharisees, who fasted on Monday and Thursday.... In the West the Saturday of each week was kept later as a stational fast day (...as a continuation of the Friday fast). It was dedicated to the memory of Christ's repose in the sepulchre. The ancient meaning of Wednesday, Friday and Saturday has been retained only at the Embertides" (Stapper/Baier, Catholic Liturgics. 1938. pp. 91-92).
