

FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

This past Wednesday, we celebrated the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Opifex (translated the Craftsman or Workman). This feast was named by Pope Pius XII and assigned to May 1st in 1955 as a counter-response to Communism: emphasizing, among other things, the human quality of craftsmanship; the obligation to offer one's work to the glory of GOD; and the commandment to rest from work on the LORD's day. St. Joseph was placed as a model for us as one who works in a godly way.

Previous to that, there had long been a second Solemnity of St. Joseph celebrated in Eastertide, separate from the March 19th Solemnity of St. Joseph. In 1847, Pope Pius IX promulgated the Solemnity of the Patronage of St. Joseph to be celebrated on the Third Sunday After Easter. The feast had originated a century earlier from a request by the Carmelite Order for a liturgical Office in honor of the Patronage of St. Joseph (cf. Gueranger p. 179). In 1870, Pius IX proclaimed St. Joseph Patron of the Universal Church. Venerable Prosper Gueranger writes: "The holy Church invites us to spend this day in honouring the Spouse of Mary, the Foster-Father of the Son of God. And yet, as we offered him the yearly tribute of our devotion on March 19, it is not, properly speaking, his feast that we are to celebrate today. It is a solemn expression of gratitude offered to Joseph, the Protector of the Faithful, the refuge and support of all that invoke him with confidence. The innumerable favours he has bestowed upon the world entitle him to this additional homage" (The Liturgical Year. Vol. 8: Pascal Time – Book II.

We began this month of May - the Month of Mary, with a celebration of St. Joseph. How appropriate. Gueranger explains: "We cannot separate Mary and Joseph, were it only for their having such close connection with the mystery of the Incarnation—Mary, as being the Mother of the Son of God; and Joseph, as being guardian of the Virgin's spotless honour, and Foster-Father of the divine Babe. A special veneration for St. Joseph was the result of increased devotion to Mary. Nor is this reverence for Mary's Spouse to be considered only as a just homage paid to his admirable prerogatives: it is, moreover a fresh and exhaustless source of help to the world, for Joseph has been made our protector by the Son of God Himself" (p. 176).

In the course of time, the Solemnity was moved to the Wednesday following the Second Sunday after Easter. It was such a big feast that it had an Octave. The Octave of St. Joseph was observed then sometime in April or May. It seems fitting that if we understand that Mary leads us closer to Jesus; St. Joseph leads us closer to Mary who leads us closer to Jesus. Mary also points to Joseph. The words of GOD Almighty Himself also tell us: Ite ad Ioseph! Go to Joseph! (Gen. 41:55). These words initially pointed to Joseph, the patriarch in the book of Genesis. But we understand how much greater St. Joseph is to the patriarch Joseph due to his closeness to Jesus Himself, having seen Him with his own eyes, having carried Him in his arms, having fed Him, and clothed Him. Since we consecrated ourselves to Mary during the time of St. Joseph's Feast in March, may I suggest that we make a novena to St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church now in this time as we would historically be celebrating an Octave in his honor. The novena could start today (Sunday, May 5th) tomorrow or Tuesday, to end on Wednesday, May 15th, the historic Octave Day of the Solemnity. You will find a prayer card with the novena prayer in the bulletin and in the pews. Let us entrust ourselves to the Fatherhood of St. Joseph who takes care of his household.
