FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN "Ember Week in Pentecost"

"Observe...the season of the year, in which the Holy Ghost comes to take possession of His earthly kingdom. Our Jesus, the Sun of justice, arose in Bethlehem in the very depth of winter; humble and gradual was His ascent to the zenith of His glory. But the Spirit of the Father and the Son came in the season that harmonizes with His own divine characteristic. He is a consuming Fire; He comes into the world when summer is in its pride, and sunshine decks our earth with loveliest flowers. Let us welcome the life-giving heat of the Holy Ghost, and earnestly beseech him that it may ever abide in us" (Gueranger, The Liturgical Year. Vol. 9, p. 293).

Pentecost is too big to be limited to just one day. Traditionally, Pentecost is celebrated over an octave of days. Between Pentecost Sunday and the following Saturday in the Octave of Pentecost, there are seven days, during which each of the seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit may be acknowledged. The eighth day commences the Time After Pentecost beginning with the Feast of the Holy Trinity.

During this Octave of Pentecost, the Church consecrates the season of summer to the Lord by means of three fast days: Ember Wednesday, Ember Friday and Ember Saturday – one day for each of the three months of summer. These three fast days are not so much penitential as they are fast days of thanksgiving. Pius Parsch explains: "Ember week is a recognized time for spiritual renewal, an occasion to review the past as well as to scan the future. And during these days after Pentecost we can sense more easily the original import and the spirit of joyous gratitude proper to Ember week. Gratitude, not penance, should be the dominant Ember spirit. Even fasting can be an act of thanksgiving! Let us stress positive rather than negative values in our Christian life, cultivate the consciousness of being God's holy children rather than feel ourselves as outcasts and sinners.

He continues: "Wednesday of Ember week is dedicated to Mary (Station at St. Mary Major), it is a day of interior recollection. Friday is devoted to penance, while Saturday lays greatest stress on thanksgiving. Make a summary review today of the past quarter year. These three months, covering the Lenten and paschal seasons, were certainly the most important segment of the Church's year of grace. What tremendous graces we received! But how did we use them? Are they producing fruit? Will there be a spiritual harvest?" (Pius Parsch. The Church's Year of Grace. Vol. III: Easter to Pentecost, pp. 226-227).

The week concludes with the ordination of priests which traditionally happens on Ember Saturday. This coming Saturday, June 15th, 2019 at 11 am, Archbishop Sample will ordain two priests for the Archdiocese of Portland at St. Mary's Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception: Rev. Mr. Stephen Cieslak and Rev. Mr. Stephen Kenyon. "...all the faithful are encouraged to participate and add their prayers of thanksgiving to God for this year's new priests" (Archdiocesan website). It is fitting that the faithful would be called to fast for three days on behalf of those being ordained. The Church needs holy priests and it is up to us all to pray, fast, and sacrifice for that intention.

The Ember fast this week is not obligatory but is of great spiritual benefit. All three days are fast days meaning one full meal and two snacks which do not add up to a full meal. Wednesday and Saturday are days of partial abstinence meaning that meat may be consumed at the main meal only. Friday is a day of full abstinence meaning that no meat may be consumed.
