FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

The Four Passions of Holy Week

In the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, according to the 1962 Missal, all four gospel accounts of the Passion of the Lord are proclaimed during the Masses of Holy Week beginning with the Passion according to St. Matthew on Palm Sunday, followed by the Passion according to St. Mark on Tuesday; the Passion according to St. Luke on Wednesday (also known as Spy Wednesday - when Judas betrayed the Lord); and finally the Passion according to St. John on Good Friday. This is a wonderful tradition of the Church which we observe at St. Stephen's. Please see the liturgical schedule for this week and consider coming to meditate upon the various Passion accounts on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday.

Baptism

On Tuesday, April 30th, Mr. Michael Peyton will be Baptized, Confirmed, and receive his 1st Holy Communion according to the traditional Roman Rite in effect in 1962. Please be praying for him and for all who are preparing to enter the Church this Easter.

New Fountain

We thank a generous parishioner who donated a new fountain in the piazza in front of the church. The angel is holding a shell which is a symbol for the pilgrim and for Baptism. How appropriate at Easter time to receive such a nice gift.
