FROM THE DESK OF FR. ERIC ANDERSEN

Merry Christmas greetings to you all. We celebrate the 6th Day of Christmas today and prepare to celebrate the Octave Day which commemorates the Circumcision and Naming in JESUS on January 1st, which is a Holy Day of Obligation dedicated also to the Holy Mother of God, the Blessed Virgin Mary. The technical term for this is Theotokos, which means God-bearer. She is named Godbearer or Mother of God, in response to the heresy of Nestorius who claimed that Jesus was not God, but merely the God-bearer (Deifer). He claimed that Mary was the mother of a man. The Council fo Ephesus condemned the heresy of Nestorianism and affirmed what was always believed by Christians: that Jesus is not the God-bearer, but that Jesus is GOD. Mary is the God-bearer (Theotokos), not the mother of a man, but the Mother of God.

Also this coming week we have funeral Masses for two parishioners: Margaret Hannigan on Thursday and Mary Klum on Friday.

On Saturday evening, January 5th, we will enter into the multi-faceted celebration of the Epiphany. There is so much to celebrate with this Solemnity which is the 12th Day of Christmas. We begin on Saturday evening at 5 pm with a sung liturgical blessing which resembles Vespers but includes the chanting of the Litany of the Saints, psalms, the Magnificat, a minor-exorcism of the parish, the blessing of Epiphany Water, the sprinkling of the people with the same water and concludes with the singing of the Te Deum. The people are asked to bring holy water bottles to take some home to bless their homes with a special blessing of homes The blessing of water on Epiphany on Epiphany. acknowledges a couple of things: first, that the Epiphany celebrates three manifestations of the Lord, one being His Baptism in the Jordan. Therefore, we bless Holy Water on this feast in commemoration of Baptism. Secondly, we acknowledge the need for conversion and baptism by recalling the three wise men, or Magi, who began as astronomers, and astrologers, worshipping the pagan deities identified with the stars and planets. They converted and renounced paganism when they came to adore the True God Jesus Christ. A major theme in the liturgies and blessings at Epiphany is the conversion of the Gentiles brought about by the Incarnation, birth and manifestation of the Newborn King by the Star of Bethlehem. In this spirit, we bless chalk to use with the water in blessing our homes.

On Sunday morning, January 6th, we will continue this celebration at Mass with the Announcement of the Moveable Feasts for the coming year; plus the blessing of Gold, Frankincense, and Myrrh; and the blessing of chalk to be taken home for the Epiphany House Blessing. The text of the blessing will be included in next week's bulletin. This is the blessing that will mark the doors of our homes and rooms, with the following: +20+C+M+B+19+. More on this blessing to come next week. Please join us on Saturday evening for the blessing of Epiphany Water and bring a holy water bottle to take some home.

Confession may be made during the eight days preceding or following the first Saturday of each month, provided that Holy Communion be received in the state of grace. Should one forget to form the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, it may be formed at the next Confession, the occasion to go to confession being taken at the first opportunity." Please join us this month after morning mass on Saturday, January 5th.


INQUIRING ABOUT THE CATHOLIC FAITH?
