

### FROM THE DESK OF FR. ERIC ANDERSEN

We come now to the end of the Advent season and prepare to celebrate the Nativity of the Lord, the birth of Jesus Christ; fully God and fully Man; the Savior of the world; King of the Universe; the long awaited Messiah; the Desire of the Everlasting Hills; the Word from the beginning, from eternity, breaking into time. "And into what St. Bede called 'the fleeting and wave-tossed course of time' came the changeless and everlasting Word. Without abandoning His eternity, He took upon Himself our temporality in order to make us temporal men partakers by glory of the eternity that is His with the Father and the Holy Spirit. 'O Word, who dost exist before time, through whom time was made, who wast born in time even though thou art life eternal: thou dost call those who exist in time and make them eternal" [St. Augustine, Enarratio in psalmum 101, no. 10] (John Saward. Cradle of Redeeming Love, Ignatius Press, 2002. p. 304).

"The evangelists fix the time of our Saviour's birth within an identifiable period of human history: in the days of King Herod' (Mt 2:1; cf. Lk 1:5), in the reign of the Roman Emperor Caesar Augustus (cf. Lk 2:2). The Roman Martyrology, in the edition of Baronius, sets this moment within the great context of universal history:

In the five thousand one hundred and ninety-ninth year of the creation of the world, from the time when God in the beginning created the heaven and earth; the two thousand nine hundred and fifty-seventh year after the Flood; the two thousand and fifteenth year from the birth of Abraham; the one thousand five hundred and tenth year from Moses, and the going forth of the people of Israel from Egypt; the one thousand and thirty-second year from the anointing of David the King; in the sixty-fifth week according to the prophecy of Daniel; in the one hundred and ninety-fourth Olympiad, the seven hundred and fifty-second year from the foundation of the city of Rome; the forty-second year of the rule of Octavianus Augustus, all the earth being at peace, in the sixth age of the history of the world, Jesus Christ, eternal God, and the Son of the Eternal Father, desiring to sanctify the world by His most merciful coming, being conceived by the Holy Ghost, and nine months having passed since His conception [here the voice is raised and all kneel, is born as man, in Bethlehem of Judea, of the Virgin Mary. The Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ according to the flesh." (Saward, p. 306)

We have much to be thankful for and much to celebrate. Let us truly embrace these next 12 Days of Christmas (Dec 25th – Jan 6th) and give our greatest gifts to JESUS. He asks for one thing only: our very self. Let us give our very self to Him: our hearts, our minds, our souls, our eyesight, our hearing, our sense of smell, and taste, and touch. Let us walk in His footsteps, speak His words, and love with His Sacred Heart. Let us draw close to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the Most Pure Heart of St. Joseph and kneel in adoration with them in awe and wonder before the coming of the Light into our present darkness. Lift up your heads! Look, your redemption is at hand!
