#### FROM THE SEMINARIAN'S DESK

These last two weeks, we've been looking at the four dimensions, or "pillars" of formation as outlined in the USCCB's *Program for Priestly Formation* (PPF): Intellectual (or Academic), Pastoral, Human, and Spiritual. So far, we've examined the Academic and Pastoral dimensions.

This week we'll take a look at the Spiritual dimension of seminary formation. As noted previously, the academic dimension tends to get a lot of focus in seminary because it is the most obvious and measurable element of our formation. The spiritual dimension, however, is where most of the important work of developing a priestly identity takes place. Certainly there is some overlap between the dimensions, as spirituality is a focus for some of the courses we take, not to mention that a good spirituality flows over into our ministry in the Pastoral dimension. But taken in itself, the Spiritual dimension has as its end a deepening of the seminarian's relationship with God through a strong prayer life centered on the Eucharist.

Each seminarian is required to pray Morning and Evening Prayer (Lauds and Vespers) in community on the weekdays, along with daily Mass. Seminarians are also encouraged to pray the other 'hours' of the Liturgy of the Hours. In addition to these required communal prayers, the seminarian is highly encouraged to make a holy hour each day. At Mount Angel, we have exposition and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament for an hour each weekday. The seminarian's spiritual life is largely dependent on his own initiative, so the responsibility of cultivating a deep prayer life lies ultimately with the seminarian himself.

This isn't to say he has to do it all alone. Each seminarian is assigned a spiritual director with whom he meets every other week for an hour. In spiritual direction, the seminarian can bring things he is struggling with, insights he has gained, consolations and desolations he has experienced, or questions about discerning the call. What the seminarian says to the spiritual director is in what we call the "internal forum," meaning that information given to the spiritual director is not shared with the formation faculty. It's not quite like the seal of confessional, but it does free up the seminarian to get help with things he may be struggling with.

Seminarians at Mount Angel are given a required five day silent retreat each year before the semester starts in January. In addition, there are weekly conferences which touch on spiritual and formational topics. Seminarians are also split into groups called "Iesus Caritas Groups," where they can pray and share things with their fellow seminarians and receive support and prayer from them in turn.

Sometimes, seminarians are given special opportunities for further spiritual growth. Students entering Theology I participate in the seminary's "Intensive Spirituality Program," which is a three week long silent retreat with an emphasis on priestly identity and discernment. Some few seminarians are also sent to the Institute for Priestly Formation in Omaha, NE, which is where I was able to spend the summer last year. There, I was able to grow much deeper in my spiritual life and came to a better idea of the priesthood of Jesus Christ and how it flows into the ministerial priesthood. It was a very valuable experience and really shifted my perspective on my vocation.

### SUNG VESPERS: EVERY SUNDAY EVENING

Join us each **Sunday at 5:00 pm** as we offer Vespers, the Church's ancient prayer for early evening, using the Latintexted Roman Breviary of 1962. Come and sing the psalms with us, or just listen and pray along with the words and melodies which have nourished the saints and praised God for millennia. We provide booklets with all the chants, texts, and side-by-side English translations.

#### PHILOSOPHY NIGHT:

Thursday, July 19th Dan Lower, speaker. We hear a lot of talk about love as a driving force--perhaps the main driving force--of what will be good for us and good for the world. e.g.: "All You Need is Love"; "Love, and do what you will"; "In our America, love wins"; and "Love your neighbor as yourself." But is love up to the task? Can love be the good? And what does love mean in this context, anyway? Does it mean friendship? Love of country or the world? Or something else? Mr. Lower will be drawing inspiration in form and content from C.S. Lewis's classic reflection The Four Loves. Our quest will be on two lines of philosophical inquiry: First, is love the Good? Second, which type of love? Along the way we will explore the serious foibles and failings of humans and their loves, the difficulty of getting at these questions in a philosophical manner, and what sorts of help Lewis's explorations and ours might be for our lives. No reading required beforehand. Just show up. If you want to read an awesome book in the interim, though, you can feel free to pick up The Four Loves. Snacks provided. Ages High School and up. #### CCD CORNER

Summertime CCD Part II

Last week we talked a little about the structure of the Bible and how important it is for our children to know about the Bible itself. This week, let's focus on teaching a little bit about the Gospels. Even our littlest CCD students can learn and understand about the Gospels. The Gospels occupy the central place in Scripture [Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCD, nos. 125, 139). So what do the Gospels tell us? First, they proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ, the Word of God, the definitive Revelation of God. Second, the Gospels contain a record of the life of Jesus Christ and his teachings and redeeming work. Third, the Gospels lead us to accept Jesus Christ in faith and apply his teachings to our lives. We call the Books of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, the Synoptic Gospels. Children can learn that these Synoptic Gospels contain (CCD, nos. 512-667): the Infancy narratives (in Matthew and Luke), the Baptism of Jesus, the Temptation of Jesus, the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew, Jesus teaching including parables, the miracles, and the Last Supper, the Passion, Death, Resurrection and Ascension. Why not create a small quiz bowl for the kids and adults in the family? Can you find where each of the important foundations of the faith are in the Gospels? Or another idea is to focus on learning more about the authors of each of the Books, St. Matthew, St. Mark, St. Luke and St. John. Ordinary time can be a great time to teach and learn more about the Bible. See you again next week.
